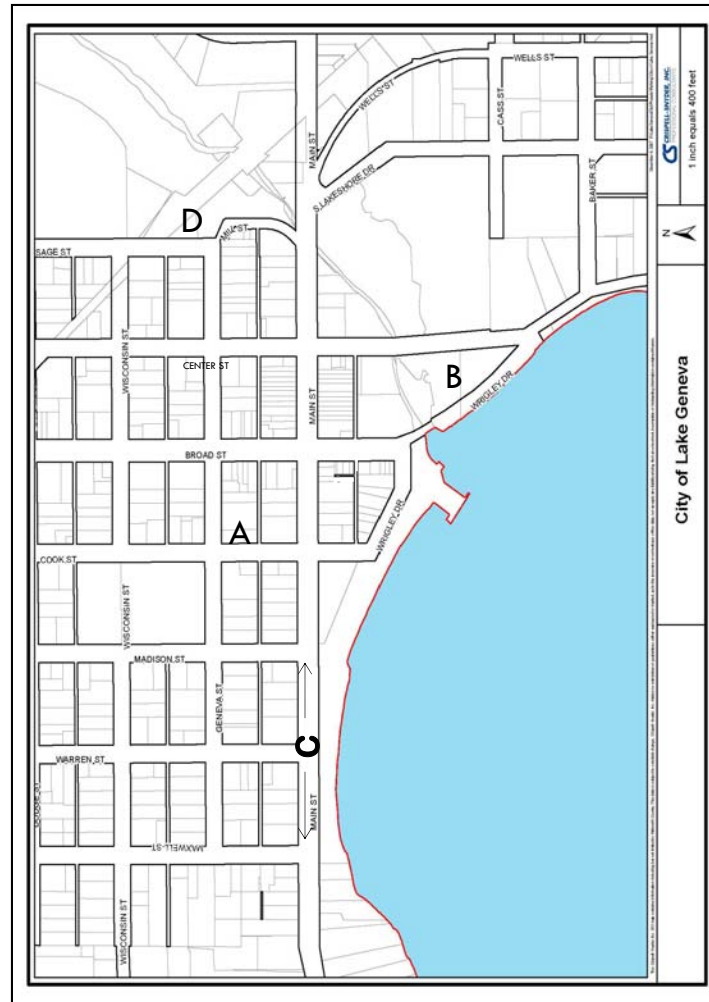

PARKING Rules & Regulations



PARKING PERMITS

Resident

Any person who is a resident or non-resident-property-owner with a vehicle registered to that person shall be eligible for this type of parking sticker. This sticker allows parking for 2 hours at any stall except the red meters and the 12-minute meters without depositing money in the meter. This sticker is free and renews every even numbered year.

Seniors

Any person who is at least 62 years old and a resident or non-resident-property-owner shall be eligible for this type of parking sticker. This sticker is free and allows the recipient to park at a meter for the full length of the meter without depositing coins except at the red meters and the 12-minute meters.

Business in the City of Lake Geneva

Any business owner within the City limits of Lake Geneva may purchase, for the sum of Ten Dollars (\$10.00) for a two-year period, a City 2-hour Parking Sticker. This sticker allows parking for 2 hours at any stall except the red meters and the 12-minute meters without depositing money in the meter.

Walworth County Residents

Any resident of Walworth County with a vehicle registered to that person at their Walworth County address may purchase, for the sum of Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) for a two-year period, a residential 2-hour parking sticker which will allow parking at any stall for 2 hours except the red meters and the 12-minute meters without depositing money in the meter.

Parking Lot Pass

A parking lot pass is valid only at the Cook Street Parking Lot and the lower Center Street Parking Lot from 9am until 7pm seven days a week. Parking is available on a first-come-first-served basis; the permit holder may be forced to park in a stall elsewhere and deposit the required coins if there are no stalls in the lots available. Parking availability is not guaranteed. The cost of the permit shall be Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) for each calendar year if purchased on or before August 1st and One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) if purchased after August 1st in any year. Only forty (40) permits are issued annually.

HOURS

The limited parking in the Parking meter zones shall apply from 9am to 7pm Monday through Saturday, and 12pm to 7pm Sunday.

Exceptions: Each year from November 1st until April 30th the following year, two-hour free parking shall be established for all parking zones.

The following Parking Areas are free from November 1st - April 30th:

- A. COOK STREET Municipal Parking Lot.
- B. CENTER STREET Municipal Parking Lot.
- C. MAIN STREET, south side, from Madison Street west to Maxwell Street.
- D. SAGE STREET Municipal Parking Lot (No meters. Free year-round.)

FINES

Fines are payable immediately. Fines double if not paid within five (5) days. For your convenience, fines may be paid at the following locations:

A. Hand deliver to City Hall Front Desk.

B. Place in envelope with first-class postage and mail to address on reverse side of ticket and drop in any U.S. Mail Box.

C. Pay on-line at www.cityoflakegeneva.com (a service charge will apply).

The City of Lake Geneva retains the right to place any unpaid tickets with a collection agency.

WINTER PARKING RESTRICTIONS

From November 15 through March 31 of the following year, vehicles may not park between the hours of 2am to 6am on any City street and year-round from 3am to 6am downtown. No vehicle may be left parked on any City street for a period of time longer than 24 consecutive hours.

Vehicles may not park on the street until the snow has been plowed to the curb line. Signs have also been erected, prohibiting parking on certain streets to facilitate snow removal. Vehicles parked in violation of these regulations may be ticketed by the police and may also be towed away during snow and ice control operations.

Any assistance with snow removal around fire hydrants would be appreciated.
